Cold Peace? The Next Stage of EU-Russia-Relations

Thursday, 22 April 2021

This year's conference will reflect current political and social dynamics in Russia and the post-Soviet space. How should the EU respond to these developments? How should we deal with a regime in Russia that is violating other states' sovereignty, aims to undermine the EU, takes side with authoritarian rulers near and far, and tries to suppress any dissent at home? How to support civil society and the revived pursuit of democracy in Russia and other post-soviet countries? In addition to these overarching questions, we want to explore two topics shaping the relations between Russia and the West: (1) The Biden administration's policies towards Russia and the opportunities for a concerted transatlantic strategy; (2) How is climate change and the need for a departure from fossil fuels shaping EU-Russia relations? Is this a new area of conflict, or are there chances for cooperation?

The invitation-only expert conference will be held under Chatham House Rules. A public discussion will follow in the evening.
